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Education For All Through Community Development

FIOHTG'S EDUCATION FOR ALL (EFA) CAMPAIGN KICKSOFF





FIOHTG's annual EFA campaign took place in June in the North Bank, Lower River, Central River and Upper River regions. Beneficiaries included the communities of Bayaba, Samba Chargie, Nyawurulung, Amdalai, Dongronding and Felenkoto which are feeder villages to Darsilameh village and Kaboto just to mention a few. The theme centered on retention as both organizational and national records have shown low retention rate of the children in the targeted communities. Therefore the campaign was aimed at increasing awareness on the role of education and encouraging parents to keep their children in school. However, many other issues affecting the education sector were discussed. A burning issue discussed in Nyawurulung was poor performance in the National Assessment Test results (NAT).

Mr. Kemo S. Kinteh, FIOHTG programme officer at the School Development Unit found that Kabakoto had enrolled 104 pupils in Grade 1 about 6 years ago, but that number has dwindled to only 54 pupil who are now in Grade 6. This means that almost half dropped out in 5 years. The drop out rate for this particular class, school and year is 10 children leaving school each year which is alarming. However, programme officers of the School Development Unit namely Amadou Sambou, Kemo S. Kinteh and Cherno Ceesay are optimistic that the awareness campaign will help in addressing the issue.

It is this and similar cases which inform the campaign. Typical of FIOHTG education related activities, in attendance were the cluster monitor, EFA regional focal point, regional office representative, cluster trainers, teachers, SMC members and parents.

It was very sad to leave those who always

make me smile and have patiently tried to teach me Mandinka every day. However, I leave FIOHTG with a lot of experiences and lots of lovely memories.

ments of the Gambia and Senegal and organized by Jaha Dukureh, Executive Director of Safe Hands for Girls. The summit graced by high dignitaries including the Vice President of the Gambia, Dr. Isatou Touray brought over 700 participants of government representatives, gender activists, development practitioners, community and religious leaders to Dakar. Jaha Dukureh gave a passionate opening state-

ment which saw many people in tears, as she explained her ordeal as a girl. Her story is affirmed by Ebrima Drammeh as a representation of the many troubles Gambian girls especially in rural areas battle with. Further to the significant deliberations which took place, the summit availed the FIOHTG delegates the opportunity to network with gender activists including Jaha Dukureh and CSO

The event was coordinated by Rose T. Mendy and Omar Cham program officers in the community development unit of FIOHTG while Saiba T Suso served as one of the facilitators.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Alimatou Marong and Ebrima Drammeh both of the Community Development Unit conducted several management training in June. In Kaba-

koto. Madam Marong had a recap of the previous day's session, followed by the ring game to practice some of the ten competencies like persistence, taking calculated risk etc. This will place the entrepreneurs on a better footing for a successful business.
