#### FIOHTG ENDS CARAVAN TOUR; UNITY FESTIVAL TO FOLLOW



FIOHTG has concluded its caravan tour in the Central River Region. The tour is aimed at sensitization communities on democracy and the essence of political pluralism and tolerance. It covered towns where weekly markets locally called Lumoo are held; thus lumoolu of Kaur, Kuntaur, Jarumeh Koto and Wassu all in CRR North and Brikamaba, Kudang, Jareng and Bansang in CRR South were reached.

The Programme was coordinated by Ebrima Drammeh and Alimatou Marong of the Community Development Unit and facilitated by officers of the National Council on Civic Education. FIOHTG has a long standing relationship with the NCCE as both work to promote civic education, thus NCCE officers often serve as resource persons at FIOHTG organized event. The event which targeted 6000 people during the 4 days event started on 28th October 2019 at the Wassu Lumoo. Buyers and sellers at the Lumoo listened to messages of pluralism and tolerance from NCCE staff, IEC Regional Coordinator while they were entertained by the renowned traditional Janjanbureh based drummer-comedian, Takatiti.

Speaking to listeners at the Jareng Lumoo, the NCCE officer, explained the importance of national dialogue in pluralism likening its essence to the gathering of members of a household to discuss their concerns and how to improve their living. Elsewhere in Bansang, similar messages including the meaning and practice of democracy was passed to the onlookers. Following the session, listeners and participants were asked questions to gauge their understanding of the messages received.

Mr. Drammeh reporting from the tour said that "the program is funded by a gift of the United States Government through the International Republican Institute (IRI)." The Caravan tour on political pluralism and tolerance ended at the Brikamaba lumoo on 2nd November 2019. The Conference dubbed "Doing Business with Finland" aimed at orienting countries and organisations on accessing funding from Finland was attended by Mr. Yankuba Manneh, Mr. Amadou Sambou, Madam Rose T. Mendy and Mr. Lamin Ceesay. The event availed delegates the chance to explore opportunities in Finnish organisations especially in Education, Agro-processing and Green Economy through the Finpartnership Matching service and Business Proposal from Finnish companies. During the programme, the FI-

OHTG delegates led by Mr. Manneh introduced the work of FIOHTG to the delegates. On arrival at the FIOHTG, the delegates expressed delight at the window of opportunities provided by the conference. Meanwhile the delegates visited other organisations such as PFONGI which is an umbrella body of 52 organisations in Senegal to explore partnership opportunities. The delegates also visited Madam Fatou Sarr who processes aloe Vera into products such as body lotion, mosquito repellant, soap amongst others.

### FIOHTG TRAINS SCHOOL GIRLS, TEACHERS & PARENTS ON THE PRODUC-TION OF AFFORDABLE & SUSTAINABLE SANITARY PADS



FIOHTG concluded a sensitization and training on Menstrual Hygiene Management and the Production of sustainable sanitary pads to girls, teachers and parents in St. Georges Upper and Senior Secondary School and Darsilami Basic Cycle School. The activities conducted under the Keep Our Girls in School Project is aimed at addressing the challenges girls face in managing their menstruation according to best standards. Mr. Sambou, one of the trainers who doubles as an educationist, said that "performance in school has a correlation with punctuality and regularity. School girls who reached the age of menstruation are seriously affected by lateness and absenteeism thus retarding their performance. In this project girls are sensitized on menstruation and also shown how to produce sanitary pads locally. These pads are reusable for a long period and are environmental friendly". The Acting Country Director of FIOHTG, Madam Sarr, who went to see the training emphasized that the training is an empowering one for girls as the knowledge they gain from the session is indispensable. She urged all to support the endeavor. Meanwhile both Madam Secka and Madam Lundahl have expressed their desire in expanding the project to other schools.

## **TRAINING ON REPORT WRITING & REFLECT HELD IN TAD**



A training on qualitative and quantitative report writing and reporting for TAD staff started on the 14th October 2019 at the office of Tumana Agency for Development in Tinkinjo, URR. In his welcoming remarks, Mr. Muhammadou B. Drammeh, Executive Director of TAD asked the FIOHTG officials and the participants to feel at home. He recalled that FIOHTG has promised to help in capacity development and this train is in fulfillment of that pledge. He urged all to make good use of the opportunity to build their skills.

Mr. Bubacarr M. L. Camara, Senior Programme Officer at Community Development Unit of FIOHTG who led the FI-OHTG delegation thanked TAD for the hospitality. He added that the training organized is inline with the new partnership agreement between TAD and FIOHTG to help in improving the capacity of TAD volunteers. Mr. Camara further stated that the training is twofold, one will be on report writing and the other on REFLECT. pacity on qualitative and quantitative report writing. Mr. Muhammed Lenn the Monitoring and Evaluating (M&E) Officer of FIOHTG exposed participants to basic tips on report writing, different reporting schemes, etc. Participants were exposed to Results Based Reporting and at the end of the training, participants together with Mr. Lenn and Mr. Camara developed reporting templates for TAD and the REFLECT Facilitators as well as the Supervisor.

Meanwhile Mr. Camara led the sessions on RELECT. These sessions targeted newly recruited Reflect Facilitators in URR and other facilitators from other regions. Participants were taken through the genesis of REFLECT, its significance in the promotion of literacy and development. Mr. Camara further exposed participants to the various tools available to them in the conduct of their sessions. In his closing remarks, he urged the newly trained facilitators to be opened and think radically as they are about to witness the most radical transformation in their lives.
