




BUBA FABURAY, COUNTRY DIRECTOR RETIRES; FIOHTG BIDS FAREWELL

Madam Sarr shed tears as she spoke about the morning discussions she had with Faburay almost daily as HR Officer. She wished the man she affectionately called "My Boss" well in all his endeavours. A statement was read by Alagie Sanneh on behalf of Kristina Lundahl, the Chairperson of Gambia Grupperna Swedish Board who expressed satisfaction in working with Faburay. Meanwhile Joanna Mendy, the Board Chairperson of FIOHTG said retirement is a time to enjoy and she wants to wish Faburay well but wouldn't bore the gathering with a long speech. She declared that "Let there be merriment". Mr. Yabo, who graced the occasion on behalf of all NGOs as the Director of TANGO reflected on his relationship with Faburay.
