6 DAYS SENSITIZATION ON GENDER BASED VIOLENCE & ABUSES CON-CLUDED BY FIOHTG



A six days sensitization on gender based violence for contractors and youths has been concluded by Mrs. Marong. Mrs. Marong is the GBV focal person of FIOHTG on its World Bank funded School Project. Reporting from CRR, Mrs. Marong said that "the activity is intended to ensure that the rights of the community are not being violated, more especially women, girls and children who are most often vulnerable". During the sensitisation, participants were taken through what constitutes gender based violence, abuse of girls, children and women. It is expected that the presence of FIOHTG contractors and labourers building school facilities in communities will not lead to abuses, teenage pregnancies and violence.

FIOHTG is committed in not only fighting to abolishing gender based violence and abuse in communities but it is also enforcing strict regulations to ensure that its staff and affiliates are not perpetrators.



FIOHTG REACHES 100% CEREAL BANK COVERAGE FOR ITS VDPS







FIOHTG takes food security seriously. Food is a right and an entitlement. It is also the basics. Knowing that the Gambia in general and particularly rural communities are challenged by lack of food security, it launched its Cereal Banking Scheme.

The initiative starts with the provision of money for cereals to the communities. The communities proceed to buy the cereals which are then kept until the rainy season when families battle lack of food and hunger. The cereals are then distributed by the villagers amongst the needy. The Cereal Banking Scheme allows communities to design their management style which includes setting a committee and agreement over the payment modalities. Communities pay the cereal back with cereal after their harvests to make the scheme grow.

Thanks to generous support and partnership with Gambia Groups through Kristina Lundahl and ForumCiv, FIOTG is happy to report that it has reached its target to establish cereal banks for all the Village Development Projects. This means that 17 VDPs and their satellites of over 120 villages in North Bank, Lower River, Central River and Upper River regions have benefitted from the scheme.

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Mr. Ebrima Drammeh who went around the country to implement the scheme broke the news to staff. "*The capitalisation and sensitisation meet-ings have now been completed…Its a 100 % coverage now which has been achieved in a short time possible thanks to the support received from Kristina Lundhal of the Gambia grupperna in Sweden and forumciv funding*". Mr. Drammeh added that "*the beneficiaries are so*

Mr. Drammeh added that "the beneficiaries are so appreciative of the timely support as this is expected to significantly strengthen the communities' capacity to ensure access to food at the local level especially during the lean period of July to September each year". FIOHTG will continue to work with partners to strengthen the scheme for more beneficiaries. We know the communities are growing and demand is increasing with decreasing farm yields. We are looking for partners to provide cereal storages in the communities.





FIOHTG CONCLUDES YOUTH FORUMS WITH 480 YOUTH IN URR, CRR, LRR & NBR



FIOHTG has concluded a 6 day youth forum in Central River Region and Upper River Region. The forums held in Wellingara Yareh, Bayaba, Sare Demba Dardo and Sare Ngallen were facilitated by Rose T. Mendy and Malick Ndimballand of the Community Development Unit.

The Forum is meant to raise awareness and create a platform for young people to discuss issues affecting them. During the forums in the different communities, participants discussed 'illegal/irregular migration', early marriage, teenage pregnancy, gendered roles, conflict, education, female genital mutilation and drug abuse.

Lamin Conteh, an Intern at the M&E Unit who graced the forums said that the activity was very interactive and educative as young people shared their experience on the thematic issues discussed. Commenting on migration, he said that although 'returnees' shared the dangers on irregular/ illegal migration, youth present gave reasons they why they find it compelling to travel. A key reason given by youth as a cause was the lack of economic opportunities in their communities.

Bucarr Dampha, a returnee from Libya told his mates that: "I embarked on this risky journey in 2016. The difficulties I encounter are unbearable because it was filled with trauma. I didn't made it to Europe and I had to struggle back home. My advice to young people is we should not risk it".

A similar activity was facilitated by Alimatou Marong in North Bank Region and Lower River Region bringing together 240 youth in the communities. It is envisaged that the events promote awareness creation and networking amongst the youth.
