


FIOHTG WRAPS UP STEP-DOWN TRAINING ON COMPETENCY BASED CURRICULUM

Future In Our Hands The Gambia through the NDOKK-Food for Education Project concluded a 2-day step down training on Competency Based Curriculum held at Regional Education Directorate in Kanifing.

The event was attended by teachers from Region one.

The objective of the training was to introduce the Revised Competency -Based Education Curriculum to be rolled by MoBSE to all FFE/NDOKK Project schools, strengthen knowledge and skills of grades 1, 2 and 3 teachers on the use of the Revised Competency-Based Education Curriculum and to equip teachers in FFE/NDOKK Project schools to adapt and apply the revised competency-based education curriculum.

The 2-day training enabled participants to demonstrate different practical skills of teaching methods, such as competency-based curriculum, presentation on the syllabus design, assessment and evaluation and importance of feedback in the teaching and learning process, etc.

In a similar but separate engagement, The Catholic Relief Services (CRS) in collaboration with Future In Our Hands The Gambia organized a day's training on Universal Design for Learning. The Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a framework to improve and optimize teaching and learning for all people based on scientific insights into how humans learn.



CDU CONCLUDES VDC TRAINING IN KERR MAMMA

The Community Development Unit under the purview of FIOHTG conducted yet another VDC training in Kerr Mama Cluster, Upper Niumi District in North Bank Region. The training is intended in improving the lives and livelihoods of the most valuable communities.

The training was aimed at enhancing the capacities of the VDCs for effective program intervention that will foster community development and sustainability.

Kerr Mama is one of the new VDPs that has been phased in recently. It has four satellite villages namely; Kerr Juma, Kayel, Kerr Ngumbo, Medina Sangalko.

The training focused on the following area but not limited to;

- Introduction to the concept of VDC
- Selection/ Election of VDC- separation of power
- Local Government Act, 2002 and role of VDC in decentralized rural governance
- Functions of VDC members, individual and collective roles
- Selection of subcommittees, the rationale of its formation
- Establishment of Ward Development
 Committees and their relationship with VDCs
- Record keeping, meeting minutes, financial records, membership register, visitors book
- Constitutions and By- laws and their importance to their governance system
- Strategies of resources mobilization and planning- advocacy, networking, lobbying, and linkage creation.

The training was facilitated by Lamin Marreh and Alpha Khan from the Department of Community Development and Kerewan Area Council, respectively.

Jawo Kunda cluster in Kantora district, Wuli Barrow Kunda in Wuli West district and Misera in Sandu district also benefited from this activity.



FIOHTG HOLDS A SESSION ON REQUEST CONCEPT NOTE

Future In Our Hands The Gambia (FIOHTG) through its Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning Unit (MEAL) held a day session with staff on the Request Concept Note Template at FIOHTG conference room in Kotu South.

The objective of the session was to holistically look at the request concept note template that outlines a project objectives, methodology, expected results and budget. At the end of the session, participants' understanding and competencies were enhanced in a bid to make request using a standardize request template.



CDU WRAPS UP HUMAN RIGHTS SENSITIZATION MEETINGS IN JAWO KUNDA CLUSTER

The Community Development Unit of FIOHTG concluded a five-day training and community-based sensitization meetings on basic fundamental human rights in Jawo Kunda cluster in Kantora District, URR.

Jawo Kunda is one of the new phased-in communities to benefit from FIOHTG interventions for the period of three years as stated in the contract signed with them. Possibly, there can be extension depending on the need to do so.



The activity was aimed at enhancing the capacities of the communities to safeguard basic fundamental human rights that are bestowed on them by the virtue of the fact that they are human beings. In addition, they were also reminded about their responsibilities in the promotion of human rights issues in a bid to protect their rights and that of others, especially those of women and children.

This discussion focused on the right to education, health, security, freedom of expression and association, to be protected from inhumane treatment, to vote and be voted for, and to be protected from harmful cultural practices amongst others.

FGM still remains a major impediment to the protection of the rights of women in most communities in rural Gambia. The recent Women Bill tabled in a bid to repeal the Anti-FGM law enacted in 2015 has triggered intensive debates in communities as some people support the repeal, making reference to its Islamic backing. Some Muslims are seeing it as a threat to Islamic beliefs and thoughts.

In one of the communities sensitized, the Imam informed the community members that they should be careful about the issue of FGM because it's still a law and advised them to be law abiding and anything inconsistent with law shouldn't be avoided for the sake of peace and tranquility in the country.

Other gender based violence issues such as child marriage was also discussed, reminding them that they should keep their girl child in school and avoid the practice of child marriage to earn them a better future.

A staff of the National Human Rights Commission, an institution mandated to promote and protect the rights of the citizens and residents of this country, served as the resource persons of this activity. Hiring their services has not only made the activity fruitful but also introduced these communities to the existence of NHRC and its mandates. We look forward to building a strong collaboration through an MOU.

The communities were tasked to establish a human rights subcommittee to be under the purview of the VDC to protect and promote human rights issues in their communities.

FIOHTG, CRS REGIONAL TA TO FOSTER COLLABORATION IN ROLLOUT OF NUTRITION, WASH IN FFE PROJECT SCHOOLS

Ebrima Drammeh, CDU Manager, FIOHTG pointed out that the organization has done lot of activities in nutrition training, they have partnered with Community Health Nurse in the popularization of nutrition programs in the communities.

The delegation was led by Halimatou Bah Nutrition TA from Catholic Relief Services. Amadou Sambou SDU Manager said his unit is FIOHTG's unit responsible for in-service teacher training, campaign for enrollment, retention and completion of the basic education cycle.

The purpose of the assignment is to provide technical guidance in nutrition and WASH components of The Gambia FFE-NDOKK project. The discussion also entailed the integration of peer health educators program under the NDOKK Project schools.

In his welcoming remarks, Mr. Yankuba Manneh, NDOKK Project Manager for FIOHTG, expressed delight over the visit. He noted that the principal aim of the project is to improve literacy of school age children and increase the use of health and dietary practices in schools.

The materials were donated by Fatumah Freeman, a retired nursing sister based in Sweden on behalf of the NGO The Health Watchers Association.

According to the officials at the hospital, the donated items will be judiciously used. They expressed gratitude to the donor and FIOHTG for the kind gesture.

The Health Watchers Association since its formation has supported Gambians in myriad of

areas notably, education, clothing and health care, she has also rendered a helping hand in sponsoring some less privileged Gambian students who are pursuing an undergraduate degree at The University of the Gambia.

"The Health Watcher's Association is an independent, non-profit organization that has been in the business of sponsoring education and health project among the less privileged particularly for women and children. Since 2012, we have created a nation drive that provides much needed items for disadvantaged children in rural communities," Freeman stated.

She pointed out that she came to the Gambia in 1983 as a volunteer nurse to work at the Children's ward at EFSTH. She explained: "There I felt in love with the Gambia, the Gambian people and already I decided that I will continue to live in the country to focus my efforts on children, women and the maternity ward,"

She stated that the Gambia is recognized as a successful country in education with an attendance rate that surpasses the sub-Saharan average, however the majority of schools are underdeveloped by international standards. These, she said need assistance as it is imperative for young students to become academically competitive in an increasingly technological world.

The objective of the workshop was to review the assessment tools in addressing gaps of teachers for improved literacy outcomes in the project schools.

Speaking at the event, the Project Manager, NDOKK Project, Mr. Yankuba Manneh indicated that the aim of the workshop was to review the training needs of the teachers across the country.

He added that the project's objective is to improve the literacy of school-aged children and increase the use of health and dietary practices in the project intervention schools.

"We have a tool that is recognized for data assessment and the data generated from the assessment will be used for our consumption,"Mr. Manneh stated.

The Country Director, FIOHTG, Jainaba T. Sarr, noted that this is an important workshop earmarked for the training needs of Teachers as well as capture their critical needs.

Muhammed Jobarteh, Literacy Technical Advisor, CRS explained that the project is integrated as it covers two components notably school feeding and literacy.

CDU EMBARKS ON CAPITALIZATION OF COMMUNITIES CEREAL BANKING IN CRR



FIOHTG through its Community Development Unit has successfully embarked on an engagement with its Village Development Projects in the Central River Region for the capitalization of the newly phased-in communities to start a cereal Banking scheme.

The scheme is aimed at strengthening the food security of these VDPs in a bid to reduce hunger, mostly from July to September.

Four out of the nine new VDPs are capitalized to commence the scheme through the buying and storage of the coos-- for its abundance

and cheapness during the seasonal period.

The communities are: Prince in NBR, Medina Sasita in LRR and Daru and Jallow Kunda Mat Mbaye in CRR. Accordingly, the initiative is in line with FIOHTG programme strategies, that is enhancing communities' livelihoods through food security.

The beneficiary communities hailed the gesture and commended FIOHTG describing it as "one of the most important support received from donors".

They further promised to make the best use of the opportunity by ensuring its growth and sustainability.

Equally, other existing Cereal Banking schemes in Chargel and Changai cluster were monitored by the team. According to them, they are waiting on the thresher machine to thresh their coos, and immediately that's done, the community will collect them from the

concerned people. Since being capitalised, there have been improvements in the scheme because most of them are able to generate additional bags from the little interest paid.

The Village Development Committees and the Cereal Banking Committees of the various communities all expressed commitment towards expanding the scheme for a wider coverage in the communities.

GAMBIA GROUPS, FIOHTG INAUGURATE CEREAL BANK IN KERR ARDO



The Gambia Groups from Sweden in collaboration with Future In Our Hands The Gambia (FIOHTG) on Tuesday 23rd January, 2024 inaugurated a cereal bank store in Kerr Ardo funded by Berte Qvarn and Future In Our Hands Sweden.

The cereal bank which is a community -based food management strategy will pave way for the community of Kerr Ardo to be more food self-sufficient and financially independent.

Speaking at the inauguration, the Director, FIOHTG, Jainaba T. Sarr said that the cereal bank will help the community to be self-reliant and enhance their lives and livelihood.

Director Sarr affirmed that the Gambia Groups from Sweden has invested in Kerr Ardo since its operation by setting up the skills center whereby the children learn skills to be productive.

"I will extol my staff for their commitment and steadfastness for their continuous support towards the people of Kerr Ardo for timely completion of the cereal bank," Director Sarr stated.

Lisabeth from the Berte Group who doubles as the funder of the cereal bank pointed out that the cereal bank will help the community towards sustainability.

She added that, the family business, Berte Farm will continue to develop and enlarge their farm and milk in a very sustainable way for many generations.

Kristina Lundahl from the Gambia Groups stated that the cereal bank will serve as a good source of nutrition to the children.

The chairman of the Gambia Groups, Sven Nordqvist said Kerr Ardo will continue to be prosperous and developed.

Pa Mansa Secka, a VDC rep, Alhagie Joof, councillor Kerr Ardo Ward and Awa Jobe both expressed their appreciation to the benefactor for the inauguration of the cereal bank in their community.

In a similar but separate engagement, the visiting delegation visited Kerr Werico, a GCoL learning centre, the bakery and Community Garden.

The cereal banks are expected to play a significant role in enhancing the lives and livelihoods of the community members, contributing to increased crop production and promoting self-reliance.

The monitoring team extended their visits to other beneficiary communities in the Central River Region (CRR) and Upper River Region (URR).

NATIVE OF CHARGEL REJOICES OVER BOREHOLE PROJECT, EXTOLS FIOHTG'S EFFORTS


